### Message from the Chair of Governors

As we come to the end of the school year, I thought it would be good to give parents an update on the work of the Governing Body. Governors are volunteers, representing all aspects of the school community, who work at a strategic level with the Headteacher to provide the best education for the children at the school.

The Board has seen some changes this year with some Governors leaving the Board and new ones joining. We were sorry to say goodbye to Charlene, Lucy and Simon who due to work commitments, and having been on the Board for a considerable time in some cases, felt it was time to move on. More recently we have said goodbye to Brian and the Rev Scott who are both moving on to pastures new. We have welcomed Anne, Ellie, Phoebe, Sarah and Steph during the year, all keen to get to know the school and help to make a difference.

As Governors we get to enjoy the successes and strengths of the school but also to face the challenges. This year we have seen the school build on the success of the Ofsted last June and develop the school Leadership team with Special Needs coordinator Charlotte Monk joining the school. The school staff are a major asset of the school and as Governors we are pleased to work with such a skilled professional team who always put the children at the heart of

everything they do. The governor's monitoring role often involves coming into school and having discussions with school staff.

The children are always a delight, and Governors enjoy coming to special events in school but also getting to see the children during the normal school day as they take part in a variety of learning activities. Governors have monitored aspects of the Curriculum, and behaviour as well as the school values in the classroom and on the playground in addition they have met with the School Council and accompanied school visits. As a school we are justly proud of the children who work hard and enjoy their learning and all aspects of school life particularly their sport!

Challenges this year are ones familiar to all working in the public sector and are all related to finance. The school budget which Governors are responsible for ensuring is spent effectively is not getting any bigger and the demands on it are increasing. Working with the Head teacher and Business manager, who manage the day-to-day finances with great skill, Governors look to ensure that we are getting value for money when we spend and that we are prioritising spending in the areas of greatest need to ensure that the children get the resources and support they need.

The other challenge to the successful functioning of the Board is the lack of a clerk following the relocation and decision to retire of the previous post holder. We are looking for someone to minute our meetings and undertake other administrative tasks. # Free and Cheaper Activities for the Summer

## **Reminder of Uniform for September**



In addition, in line with PE risk assessments and good practice in secondary schools and sports clubs, stud earrings MUST not be worn on PE days. We suggest if your child has their ears pierced, that this is done at the beginning of the summer break so they are healed before the start of term.

### **Allergies Heads Up for September**

As an allergen aware school, please can we gently remind parents to avoid bringing nuts into school. We are not able to provide a 'no nut policy' in school as it is not possible to guarantee and enforce a nut free zone, as staff are not able to monitor all lunches and snacks from home. However, we do ask parents to try and avoid bringing in nuts in to help reduce risk of allergic reactions.

At break times, children are encouraged to eat fruit or vegetables, which will continue. However, we will be unable to allow sandwiches or cereal type bars from September, as we will have a pupil who has a severe milk intolerance, and whilst we can manage lunchtimes carefully, we would not want inadvertent contact with products containing milk during morning break, as this intolerance can also be triggered by airborne transmission- thank you for your support.
