Exciting New Project: Developing a Relational Approach

This academic year, we have been successful in gaining a grant to support this approach to behaviour management and 'readiness for learning'. A relational approach is informed by strong evidence regarding the importance of teacher-student relationships on academic achievement, mental health, wellbeing and behaviour and involves the following:

- Developing awareness and knowledge of staff regarding what is meant by relational practice and what this means practically on a day-to-day basis for how students are interacted with and responded to. This is being supported through staff CPD that involves learning about the rationale for trauma-informed practices and the evidence around Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) and how these impact development.
- Development of a behaviour policy that is implemented consistently across the school and aims to have a preventative function using de-escalation techniques and a culture that promotes a positive and calm environment.
- A system that is as effective as possible at identifying the needs of those individuals who present in the most challenging way, so that adjustments can be made where needed. A relational approach recognises that many challenging behaviours communicate something important about a young person that needs exploration.



 A commitment to using suspensions and exclusion as a last resort and an appreciation that the evidence indicates that suspensions and exclusions rarely address underlying reasons for behaviour.

We are working closely with other Somerset schools, but in particular Curry Mallet Primary School. We have together shared training days and twilights for all staff, and we are currently developing policy and practice. We are implementing the research from Paul Dix's book 'When the adults change, everything changes', developing consistent practice like our 'visible consistencies' below. In addition we will soon be forming a parent/staff/pupil 'forum' to further develop and improve.

Reminder of our 'Open Door' Policy

Curry Rivel Church of England Primary School staff ensure that they are present at the beginning/end of everyday; this enables you to pass on information and ask quick questions. If you have a concern that may require a longer conversation, please email the school office (<u>office@curryrivel.somerset.sch.uk</u>) and we will get back to you. We would ask you to communicate with us whenever you have a concern regarding your child so that we can discuss the matter and hopefully resolve it at an early stage. In the first instance, you may want to talk over a concern with the class teacher. The headteacher is also keen to know if you have any worries and is happy to talk in person or over the phone if that is easier.

Free EscapeLine Parent Session: Monday 6th February 3.30-4.30 (Tea and coffee provided)

This session is hosted by Escapeline, a charity committed to preventing child exploitation by criminal gangs across South West England. In the South West of the UK, including all areas of Somerset, there is a significant rise in county lines drug crime, whereby a large amount of young people as young as 8 years old, are being criminally and sexually exploited by gangs. These gangs proactively recruit young people to drug run in and around the South West, as well as outside the area. The gangs and criminal networks use extreme violence and intimidation towards these young people, which result in these young people feeling trapped and scared. They also train these young people to become recruiters and future gang members. As well as criminal exploitation, young people, in particular girls, are also being sexually exploited by these gangs. The charity Escapeline are providing workshops for Year 5 and 6 in school, on Monday 6th February, designed to help young people gain greater awareness of grooming, recruitment, gangs, friendship groups, peer pressure, drug facts and other dangers and most importantly how to keep themselves safe.
