Welcome Back! I hope that you have had a good summer and found at least some time and some ways to relax, refresh and 're-set'. We have an amazing first week; the children have been so happy and positive to back to school. I have been conducting visits to every classroom every day, and have been struck by how quickly the children have settled back into school routines and learning. A special welcome goes to new families joining the school, particularly those of Reception pupils- welcome to our school family! We are pleased that other pupils have joined in other year groups, and we also have a new member of staff, Ellee Andrews who has joined the Apple Trees Wrap Around Care team. Sadly, we say goodbye to Anne Gillard, Nursery Manager, as she moves to pastures new- we wish her well and thank her for all she has done for our children and families.

Communication

Communication with our families is so important to us and I just wanted to ensure you knew how we share updates with you:

- Weekly Update email (Fridays): All main information for all classes
- Termly class newsletter- hardcopy and on website (Pippin class also on Tapestry)
- Email- we will email you if there are additional messages/reminders
- Our Facebook pages celebrate what is going on in school
- Out school website has statutory information, polices and curriculum detail

If you have any questions, queries or messages, do see the class teachers or senior staff at the beginning/end of the day. If you require a longer conversation, do contact the school office to make an appointment as we will be happy to help. Please meet the class teacher in the first instance, as they will know your child best. For safeguarding concerns, please see Mrs Pook who is the Designated Safeguarding Lead. Where there are concerns or worries, please speak to us as if we are not aware we will not be able to assist. The class Whatsapp groups are really useful to families, but may not resolve school issues for you.

Curriculum Learning

It is important to us that you are fully informed about the school's curriculum and all that goes on in the classroom-your enthusiasm, interest and encouragement in your child's learning makes such a difference to your child. Today, your child/ren will be coming home with paper copies of Autumn Class Newsletters and Knowledge Organisers - these will help you have those daily conversations about the learning happening in class. You can also use the Knowledge Organisers for mini-quizzes once you have read them together with your child- you may find the children quizzing you too! This information is also on our website (Under Children/Classes).

After School Clubs

Teachers run a range of after school clubs as part of our enrichment offer. These will be outlined next week, and can be booked through School Money. Don't forget that we have Apple Trees wraparound provision from 7:30am-5:30pm Monday - Thursday and 7:30am-4:30pm on Fridays. See our website or contact the school office for more details.

Water and snacks

Please can water bottles be labelled. Reception and Key Stage one pupils have fruit provided; older children can bring in fruit or vegetables to eat at morning break- please no sandwiches, sausage rolls, crisps or bars for snack time as we have children with serious allergies and of course we want to ensure all of our pupils are choosing healthy options.

Premises

The school grounds at Curry Rivel are amazing- we are so lucky to have so much space, a large hall, front and back playgrounds, a field and an Orchard- many smaller village schools would be envious. As head teacher, I have high expectations for the school premises as I believe that the surroundings for both staff and pupils impact on how they feel about being here. Not only does our school look great because it is uncluttered and tidy, it also means that children and staff can access resources easily and it also reduces risk of accidents etc. Over the summer we have had the following works completed:

- Blenheim and Camelot classrooms, as well as other areas redecorated
- New ramp to access a Sensory Room (Room in development)
- New shelter in the Orchard, funded by a grant available through the Local Parish Council, & also supported by Yarcombe Woodland Products (Parent- Mr Cousins).

Mr Silver had completed many other premises works which may go unseen, but they are vital in keeping our grounds looking fabulous. Thank you also to Rick Hamar, parent, who has cut back our laurel hedging on Water Street. We also have new hall speakers- thank you to the PTA for supporting this.



Car parking/turning

Schools were not built with the 21st century travel in mind, so we know the challenges of getting to school. If you can walk, we encourage this. Cycling might be an option, and we do provide cycle stores at the front and back of the school. We are working with the local Travel action group to help improve safety and access for pedestrians and cyclists in the village. Thank you for parking responsibly- please can we respect our neighbours by avoiding drives etc, and also please can we avoid turning in the Water Street entrance. Thank you for your support in this.

Accelerated Reader

All pupils have their reading books for home reading- older pupils read books within Accelerated Reader ranges. Star Reader Quizzes will be taken next week, as research shows that children need some time settling back into school to gain a realistic assessment- we can use these results to move children onto a new range if needed.

Well Being

We are committed to supporting every child's well-being with a well-planned PSHE curriculum, with a relational approach to behaviour and by having Place2Be provision at lunchtime if children need someone to talk to Mrs Langford, our school Emotional Literacy Support Assistant (ELSA). The children are reminded that they can also talk to any trusted adult.

Smart Watches & Mobile Phones

Some of our pupils may have 'smart watches'- like mobile phones, children are not permitted to use them in school due to risks of loss and damage and of misuse. For those older pupils in Years 5 and 6 who, in exceptional circumstances, may need a mobile device at the beginning/end of the day, parents need to complete a 'Mobile Phone' form (Please contact the school office)- devices are stored by the school office throughout the school day.

Punctuality and procedures for late pupils

The school day starts at 8.45am and finishes at 3.15pm. At the beginning of the school day, the gates open at 8.40am and they will close at 8.45am, both front and back- pupils and parents arriving after this time will need to come through the front gates and parents/carers will be asked to inform the office for the reason for lateness- we may be able to help! I cannot stress enough the importance of being punctual in the morning. Similarly, children must be collected on time, as staff have meetings, training and preparation to attend to, which can only take place once at the end of the school day. If you are experiencing difficulties with punctuality and would like to talk to us about it, please contact the office. Thank you for your understanding regarding this very important matter.

We already have a part-time minister who works with our seven parishes but there is a vacancy for the full-time vicar and the process has now started to recruit someone for this post.
